### Let's Talk About Letter Sounds!

Even before your child can identify letters, you can start to introduce them to letter sounds. Hearing and repeating letter sounds will help your child to learn to hear the parts of words, an important step in learning how to read.

- When reading books, point out letters and make the sound of the letter. You can say, "this is a M. M makes the sound mmmmm." Have your child repeat the sound.
- Tell your child what letter their name starts with, and what sound the letter makes. Repeat this for other members of your family.
- When eating dinner, tell your child the sound that the food starts with. You can say, we're eating spaghetti. Spaghetti starts with the sound, "ssssss."
