- In a fun voice, tell your child to stand up and then sit down.
- Pour water on your child's hand to show wet, and dry it off to show dry .
- Take your child outside to show cold, and back inside by the heater to show hot.
- Practice smiling and frowning with your child to show happy and sad.
- Have your child touch your kitchen counter to show hard, and touch a blanket to show soft.
