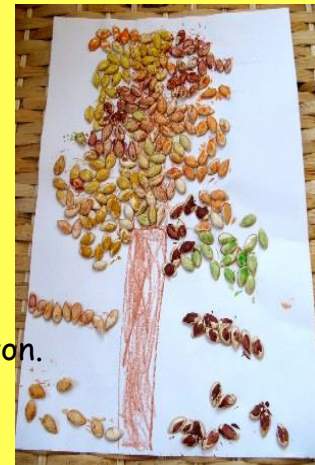


Make a Pumpkin Seed Tree!

Children love exploring pumpkins in the fall, and the seeds can be used for fun art projects!

Materials: A pumpkin, glue, paper, and a crayon. Paint or markers are optional.

- With your child, open up a pumpkin, scoop out the seeds, and lay them on a cookie sheet to dry for a few days. Talk about how the inside of the pumpkin feels.
- Help your child to draw a tree trunk on the paper using a crayon.
- Spread the glue on the paper above the tree trunk.
- Have your child place the pumpkin seeds on the glue. You can help if he/she wants help.
- Once the glue has dried, you and your child can paint or use markers to color the seeds.
